Welcome

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Welcome to Squirrels Class. We hope you had a wonderful summer and are excited to be starting in Year 2. We have got lots of exciting things planned throughout the year.

Phonics and Reading

Phonics

Reading

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Reading is a key part of our learning in Year 2. When the children can read confidently, it opens the door to so many more activities for them. Please try to find time to read with your child at least 3 times a week and record this in their reading records. It makes such a difference to their learning and they earn dojos! For shorter books, we will change them when they have been read three times to allow children to practise reading fluently. As they become more confident and move on to longer books, they will be changed when they have finished them.

In class, our reading sessions will consist of one to one reading with an adult as well as independent reading activities. We will also continue daily phonics lessons this term.

Please ensure children have their book bags in school every day so that we can easily check and change books.

Writing

Our first writing topic will be about Traction Man; a toy action figure who has all sorts of adventures. We will then move on to writing about The Day The Crayons Quit. Our main focusses this term will be to improve sentences by using adjectives, adverbs and conjunctions while continuing to work on the basics of spelling, handwriting and punctuation.

Maths

This terms units will include:

- Place value: we will be counting, comparing and ordering number 1-100.
 Children will also learn to count in 2s, 5s, 10s and 3s.
- Addition and Subtraction: we will be learning to add and subtract within and across a 10. They
 will learn patterns in addition and subtraction and use related facts to help solve bigger
 problems. We will be looking at number bonds to 100.



Science

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In science, the children will be spending lots of time in our school wild area learning about a variety of habitats and the plants and animals that live there. They will also learn to tell the difference between things that are living, dead and things that have never been alive.

Computing

At the beginning of the term we will be ensuring that children are confident with the basics of using laptops such as logging on, navigating around programs and using the mousepad and keyboard. We will then move on to using Purple Mash to create pictograms and binary trees to answer questions.

Art

Our art this term is based on the theme of maps. We will be practising lots of skills including collage, printing and making felt.



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History

In history this term we will be learning about schools throughout history. We will be looking at what has changed, what has stayed the same and which we prefer. It would be great if you and older family members could talk to your children about your experiences at school and if you have any photographs, we would love to see them!



Music

We will be listening to, creating and performing South African style music and Freedom Songs. We will also be using this to learn about Nelson Mandela as a famous and influential person in our lifetimes.



PE

Our PE lessons will be on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Please ensure children are in PE kits on these days and that they have something warm to wear as we will go outside whenever possible. Earrings should be removed either before school or by the child in school. Adults are not allowed to help with this. We will start our PE lessons by practising the fundementals such as running, jumping, throwing and catching. We will also be having lots of fun doing some team building games.

PSHE

In PSHE, we will be reminding ourselves about the Zone of Regulation which is an approach that helps children to manage difficult emotions. They will learn to recognise different emotions. It helps children to recognise strong feelings and gives them strategies to cope with these feelings so they can get back to feeling calm and ready to learn.



In RE the children will be learning about Jewish families. We will look at their beliefs and traditions and compare them to our own.



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Homework Project
