<u>Welcome</u>

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☆ ☆ Welcome to Year 5 Merlins class and to our first newsletter of the year!

Reading

We will have reading lessons four times a week. Two of these will be whole class reading lessons where we work together on our reading skills. One of these will be comprehension, where we independently apply these reading skills. Finally, we will have a session to read our class novel (as well as reading this each day).

We will do a class vote to select our first class novel of the year... I will update you when the results are in!

Writing

This term we will be focusing on different styles of writing. These will include a newspaper report, a setting description and first-person narrative writing. Our first unit will be based around a short film clip called, 'The Lighthouse'.



Reading

There will be a focus on recapping basic writing skills this half term, such as using basic punctuation, spelling words learned in previous years accurately and letter formation and handwriting. It would be great if you could support your children with these basic skills at home; please come and see me if you have any questions!

<u>Maths</u>

This terms units will include: Roman numerals Place value Addition and subtraction

Multiplication and division

Alongside these units we will continue to work on our arithmetic skills (both mental and written).



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Science

The children will learn the subject 'Properties and changes of materials'. There will be lots of practical opportunities for experimenting, investigating materials and developing working scientifically skills. Your children will investigate the processes of sieving, filtering, evaporation and learn about solutions and factors which affect the time taken to dissolve.

Computing

In computing this term the children will be learning word processing skills on Microsoft Word. The skills covered will include creating from a blank page, using text and adjusting the font, size and colour, inserting images, inserting tables and using templates.



DT

This term in DT we will be creating 'Doodlers' that can scribble on paper. We will explore circuits further and

introduce motors. To achieve this, children will investigate an existing product, which uses a motor, to explore how the product has been constructed before creating their own.

Geography

Our geography unit this term is called, 'What is life like in the Alps?' In this unit, children will learn where the Alps are and locate them on a map. They will also locate the key features of the Alps and compare this to our local area.

Music

The focus this term in music will the song 'Livin' on a Prayer', which children will learn and perform and play with instruments. In this unit children will also listen to and appraise the songs 'We Will Rock You', 'Smoke on the Water', 'Rockin' All Over the World', 'Johnny B Goode' and 'I Saw Her Standing There'.

PE

PE days this term will be Wednesday and Thursday. Wednesday's session will be outdoors, so please ensure that children are dressed appropriately for this. Just a reminder that pupils should wear the proper school PE kit or plain black shorts / bottoms with a plain white / black / purple t-shirt.

Wednesday's PE lesson will be football and Thursday's will be dance.

PSHE

In PSHE this term the children will be recapping their previous learning on the Zones of Regulation. This encourages children to recognise their emotions as well as learning strategies to support them in managing their feelings.

RE

In RE the children will be learning about Sikhism – this topic will continue throughout the Autumn Term. We will discuss the main beliefs and values as well as how Sikhism began.


















Enrichment

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As part of our Geography learning, we will go on a local area walk to be able to compare this area to the Alps.

Homework Project

Weekly homework should include a mix of reading, spelling practise (Spellingframe) and maths skills (Tackling Tables/TTRS websites). These should be recorded each week in their reading diary and the diary signed by an adult. This will be checked each Friday. If your child needs any additional practise with other skills, please come and speak to me and I will be able to suggest additional home learning activities.

Home learning project ideas related to this term's learning include...

- Complete some research on a topic of interest and present this using Microsoft Word (computing – word processing skills).
- Create a holiday brochure to persuade people to holiday in the Alps (geography).
- Write a newspaper report about a dramatic event this can be made up! (English)
