Welcome

Welcome back, I hope everyone has had a lovely break! The run up to Christmas is always such a busy and exciting time in school, here is some of what we'll be up to...

Phonics and Reading

Phonics

Following the Little Wandle Phonics scheme the children will be start on phase 3,4 and 5 sounds learning new digraphs, trigraphs and tricky words. The children will also be continuing to segment and blend and read words.

Writing

This term we will complete two book-based writing units. We will study Stanley's Stick by John Hegley where children will build on their skills from last half term to write character and setting descriptions.

The next book we will explore is The Squirrels Who Squabbled by Rachel Bright. Within this unit of learning children will further develop their ability to write at length by writing a diary entry from a characters point of view.

Finally, we will study a film titled 'Caterpillar Shoes'.



Maths

This term our first unit is addition and subtraction within 10. Children will start by working with a part whole model and securing our number bonds to 10. Then children will work on addition and subtraction sums.



Science

The children are learning about everyday materials in science. They will name and investigate a range of everyday materials and carry out tests in order to group materials according to their properties such as absorbency, waterproof, strength.



Computing

In computing, our unit is an introduction to pictograms, looking at how they can be used to represent data in picture format. Children will work to collect data from a simple experiment then input this to create a pictogram using tools on Purple Mash.



Art

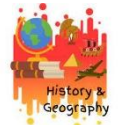
This term in art, our focus is 'Make your Mark'. We will begin by exploring line and mark making to draw water. Children will then experiment with a range of media to create an abstract composition inspired by the work of Kandinsky.

Finally, children will apply their drawing skills and knowledge to create an observational drawing experimenting with marks and materials.



History

This term our history learning is based off the key question 'How am I making history?'. Within this unit children will explore how their lives today compare to children's lives in the past. We will discuss the ways in which they are similar and the things that have changed over time.



Music

Our music focus this term is 'rhythm in the way we walk'. Children will learn how to find the beat and the pulse.

We will also be learning and singing plenty of Christmas songs in preparation for our carol concert!



PE

PE days are Monday and Tuesday. We are very lucky this term to have a PE coach who is going to teach the children gymnastics! On a Tuesday, we will be working on ball skills.



Children should come to school in their school PE kit on these days - black joggers/leggings and black hoody/sweatshirt or school jumper.

PSHE

This term in PSHE our topic is keeping safe and healthy. Within these topics we will focus on road safety and the importance of washing our hands. We aim to take the children out to cross the road directly outside of the school. This will allow the children to recognise a safe place to cross (the zebra crossing) while also being able to see how other areas are not as safe.



RE

In RE, our topic of 'People in Christianity' is continuing from last half term.

In this term, children will work to answer the key question 'Who is St Francis and what did Jesus inspire him to do'.



Enrichment

Linked to our work in art, we are hoping to have an artist come into school to talk to the children and deliver a painting workshop!



Homework Project

We will continue to send home sheets explaining what we have learned in phonics each week for the children to practice. We will also make sure that the children have tricky words to practice at home as well as their reading books each week.

In maths, we will send home the booklets linked to the current unit for children to work through.





Skills Builder

The Skills Builder Universal Framework provides a common language for building essential skills with children and young people.

Research shows that building essential skills supports social and emotional wellbeing, learning and academic outcomes and careers and opportunities.



Rewards

The children will receive 'Dojo Points' as reward for good behaviour, work and attitude.
