



Year 4 Rhinos Newsletter – Summer 1

Welcome

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We are now entering our Summer term; it is sure to be a busy, successful and action-packed one. We hope you are looking forward to an exciting half term!

Below is a summary of the learning we will be covering in Year 4.

Reading

We are continuing to develop our reading for pleasure but exploring different texts and books. We will be sharing these with each other in pairs as well as reading together as a whole class.



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Our class novels for this half term continue to be:

- An Owl Called Star
- Hacker
- Jeremey Socks Dinosaur Pox

We will be focussing on comprehension skills in a weekly reading lesson where we will be looking at different extracts and discussing/answering different types of questions.

Our focus questions are: to explain the meaning of words in context, retrieve and record true or false statements, retrieve multiple examples from a paragraph, explore reasons for the presentation of a poem and predict how a character might respond in the future.

Writing

This half term the students will be covering the Diary of a Killer Cat and Krindlekrax. The students will books to delve deeper into non-chronological reports, diary entries and writing letters.

Maths

We have covered a big bulk of our maths curriculum now so we will be spending time this te consolidating anything so far. We will also be continuing more learning about decimals and completing some measurement learning, with a focus on money and time.

It would be really helpful if you could reinforce telling the time at home as well

Science

Our science unit is called 'Living things and their habitats'. We will be looking at classification and how to sort animals. This will be done by using tables and keys.



We will look at the impact on the environment and how this has contributed to endangered species.

Computing

Our units for computing are called 'Logo' and 'Hardware Investigators'. These will cover skill about inputting instructions and commands and understanding parts of the computer and how they work.





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During our Art unit this term, children will be learning how to craft and design on fabric. We will begin by using mood boards for initial ideas and expanding on them from here. Also, we will be studying the work of William Morris, using subject vocabulary to describe his work and style.

History

In History this term, we will be Investigating whether the Vikings were raiders, traders or settlers. We will be making boats to see if the Vikings were engineers and exploring causes and consequences. Finally, we will make deductions from sources, identifying the author's viewpoint and explaining how this impacts the accuracy of the source.

Music

In music this term, we will be continuing to learn key notes on the recorder and perfecting previously taught notes. We will be practising a variety of music alongside a range of accompaniment. This will result in mini performances to the rest of the class to assess progress.

PΕ

PE days this term will be on Monday (Inside) and Friday (outside). We will be having a Gymnastics coach this term and learning athletics during the other PE session.



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PSHE

Our PSHE units relate to the theme 'The Working World' and 'A World Without Judgement'. We will be covering the units related to chores at home and breaking down barriers As part of this, we will be gaining knowledge about people that help us and the impact they have and recognising our own strengths and goals and why it is okay to be different to each other.

Spanish

Our Spanish lessons will cover the unit 'Our Classroom'. As part of this, the children will lead and write about objects found around the classroom, ask what is in a pencil case with a responsible continue exploring how to build sentences.



We will be having an enrichment day in school about our history unit 'The Vikings'. More information will come out about this closer to the time.
