| Vocabulary | Definition |
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| Festival | A festival is a gathering of people to celebrate, often on a specific day for a specific reason. |
| Celebration | To mark a holiday or an important time in a special way. |
| Past | Something that has already happened. |
| Present | Something that is happening now. |
| Belief | A belief is a firm thought that something is true, but belief is not able to be tested. |
| Tradition | The way we do things. |
| Similarities | The way in which things are the same. |
| Differences | The way in which things are different. |
